Drop off and pick up

 Please drop your children off at the classroom door between 8.45am and 8.55am, registration starts promptly at 8:55am. Please collect children at 3:25pm from our classroom door.

Class Expectations

- We are continuing to practice our Redfield Way this year, and will always aim to be kind, safe and ready.
- Show and tell will take place every Friday afternoon.
- Please **do not bring in toys** or stationery from home as we have everything the children need and it can also be upsetting if special possessions are lost or broke.

PE:

Our PE days are on a **Wednesday** and a **Thursday**. Please ensure children come to school on those days wearing suitable clothing and footwear (trainers, t-shirt, leggings, joggers or shorts). Please ensure your child has a water bottle and suncream when necessary.

Spelling

- Spelling tests will usually take place on a Friday. Spellings can be accessed on our class page on the school website and on SeeSaw.
- Each week's list of words will be linked to a particular spelling pattern, phonic sounds and statutory Year 2 spellings.

Reading

- Reading at home can have a huge impact on children's progress, as well as encouraging them to read for pleasure.
- All children will bring reading books home from school, and they may have books of their own choice from home or the public library that they choose to read.
- Children should read to an adult at least 5 times a week for 10 minutes.
- If your child mainly reads on their own, it is helpful to talk to them about what they're reading and ask them to summarise what they have read so far.
- Please record in your child's reading record when they have read. This can simply be a signature.
- The children receive a sticker every time they read 5 times in a week. If they have 5 stickers by the end of a term, they will receive a prize!

Further home learning

- 1. Read every day with your child and record the book title, page number and comment in **reading record**.
- 2. There are lots of categories to choose from on the topmarks website. (free app available) I would suggest children practice addition and subtraction <u>Addition and Subtraction Games for Children (topmarks.co.uk)</u>
 Multiplication and division <u>Times Tables Games (topmarks.co.uk)</u> and fractions <u>Fractions and Decimals Maths Games (topmarks.co.uk)</u>
 Please use the categories to access other maths learning. BBC bitesize also have a range of games: <u>KS1 Maths free game Karate Cats Primary school times tables, division, shapes, fractions BBC Bitesize</u>
- 3. Practice counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

- 4. Practice writing number formation and basic adding and subtracting skills. Writing stories or a recount of what children have done over the weekend is a good way to get them to practice their writing skills.

Communication

- Seesaw is the easiest way to contact us. We aim to reply to Seesaw messages within 2 working days.
- Please don't use Seesaw for emergency messages as we cannot check them while teaching or in meetings. Continue to call the office for emergency messages.
- A member of the Year 2 team will be available on the classroom door at 3.25pm every day. We are happy to catch up for an informal chat then and can arrange a meeting for longer conversations we will aim to arrange meetings within a week.

- We will send out all school messages through Seesaw, so please let us know as soon as possible if you are having trouble accessing your account. We will also update Seesaw with news about our learning in class and photos of the children's work.
- The school website will be updated termly to share topics maps, spelling lists and any additional resources that can support learning at home.
