Key Points – do your research

- Visit the schools if possible
- Look at BCC Admissions website what happened last year under 'Allocation of new Year 7 places for September 2020'
- Read the Admissions Criteria
- Check if you also need to complete a Supplementary Form (e.g. St Mary Redcliffe & Temple, BCCS...)
- Cathedral & Trinity 3rd October Music Aptitude Test

Key Points

- Everyone must apply
- SEND apply through us, EHCP via SEN Team all secondary schools must ensure appropriate support is in place and child's needs are met
- Use all 3 preferences if you can
- Use child's permanent address where he/she spends the majority of their time – if 50/50 care it's the address where the Child Benefit is paid
- If you are in the process of moving or living in temporary accommodation keep us informed
- Don't rely on hearsay

Any applications received after 31st October 2020 will be considered as 'Late'



Priority Areas


- Have different shapes
























Admissions Process





Admission Process

- Equal Preference System
 - Important to put your favourite 1st; 2nd favourite 2nd and 3rd favourite 3rd
 - Make sure your priority area school is at least your 3rd preference especially if you wish to apply for schools using random allocation as your 1st and/or 2nd preference
- Academies and Faith Schools set their own
 Admissions Criteria (St Mary Redcliffe = Faith criteria;
 Cathedral/Trinity/Colston's Girls'/John Cabot = Random Allocation;
 Fairfield includes Social/Medical)
- Majority of schools still use Local Authority's Criteria

Local Authority's Criteria

Places are Reserved for Children with Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) in place – applications via SEN Team

Places are then offered to:

- 1. Children in Care / Previously in Care where immediately after being in care Adoption; Special Guardianship or Child Arrangements Order was issued.
- 2. In priority area Siblings Brother, sister, half / step brother or sister, or a child of parent/carer's partner where the child for whom the place is sought is living in the same family unit at the same address as that sibling.
- 3. In priority area Geography on distance Home to school distance is measured in straight line as the crow flies, in km not miles
- 4. Out of priority area Siblings
- 5. Out of priority area Geography on distance



Case Study

- Lilly lives at 21 Cossham Road
- Parents check 'My Neighbourhood' and they live in Bristol Brunel Academy's 'Area'
- Parent visits all the schools and does a lot of research
- Lives close to BBA but would prefer Bristol
 Cathedral Choir because Mum works next door
 and best friend will be going there as has a
 sibling at the school



Scenario 1


- "I really want Bristol Cathedral Choir School. I feel is it the perfect school for Lilly. I am going to put it down as my one and only preference so that the Council wouldn't offer me anything else"
- 1st Pref Bristol Cathedral Choir School
- 2nd Pref None
- 3rd Pref None



Scenario 1- Outcome

- Lilly's application is considered under BCCS random allocation. A draw takes place and Lilly's name is drawn 897th. A place cannot be offered as the school only has 17 places.
- No other schools are listed as preferences.
- At the end of the process Denisa looks at the list of all those children yet to be offered a school, puts them on a map and offers them the nearest school with a place available which is 4km away.

Scenario 2

- "I really want Bristol Cathedral Choir School. I feel it is the perfect school for Lilly. I am going to put it down as my 1st preference. I realise that there is a strong possibility that I may not get it, so I will add Bristol Brunel as my 2nd preference."
- 1st Pref Bristol Cathedral Choir School
- 2nd Pref Bristol Brunel Academy
- 3rd Pref None



Scenario 2 - Outcome

- Lilly's application is considered under BCCS random allocation. A draw takes place and Lilly's name is drawn 523rd. A place cannot be offered as the school only has 17 places.
- Lilly qualifies for a place at BBA, the fact that it is her 2nd preference makes no difference. Her 2nd preference ranks higher than a 1st preference who lives further away.
- Lilly can still go on a waiting list for BCCS or appeal and the place at BBA will be saved while she waits.

Timetable – Key Dates

- 31st October 2020 Closing date
- Around 9th November Cut off for address change
- 1st March 2021 Offer Day! on-time applicants
- Around 15th March Parents respond to offers
- Early May 2nd Round 'late' applicants
- June/July Appeals are heard
- September 2021

 – School starts & possibly few more places offered



What to do after 1st March

- Accept the offer we would expect your child to start at this school. School will be in touch. Let us know if place is no longer required.
- Waiting list only for up to 3 schools offered place will be held unless we can offer a higher preference or September comes
- Appeal automatically added on the waiting list offered place will be held unless we can offer a higher preference, successful appeal or September comes
- Change preference(s) max. 3 schools must be in writing including reference number, child's full name, date of birth and clear order of new preferences, ask Admissions for schools with places

Waiting list or Appeal?

- Very fair transparent process
- Appeals worth a try as the Independent Appeal Panel can consider any personal, social or medical circumstances (evidence needs to be submitted)
- Appeal forms available on our website from 1st March one per school and must be returned to the address stated on the form
- Child can go up as well as down the waiting list not first come, first served basis or length spent on the waiting list
- Waiting lists are always maintained using schools oversubscription criteria



What is the 2nd Round?

- End of April we process 'Late' applications together with everyone who asked to be included on the waiting list(s) or asked for new preference(s)
- Places become available as some offered children will be e.g. going to Private schools, moving out of Bristol etc.
- We use same oversubscription criteria as in the 1st round
- Early May we only write to 'late' applicants and those we can offer places to
- If parents won't hear from us they automatically stay on the waiting list(s) – we will be in touch if we can offer a place

What Happened Last Year?

Health Warning

Things will be different this year

- More pupils in Year 6
- CST Trinity Academy PAN increase from 120 to 180
- Oasis Temple Quarter will not open in 2021
- Avanti Gardens (Steiner) secondary closed

- 1st Round Out of Area within 1.424km radius
- End of Process In Area within 675m radius
- Bristol Metropolitan Academy
- 1st Round Out of Area within 1.130km radius
- End of Process In Area within 246m radius
- Fairfield High School
- 1st Round Out of Area within 1.192km radius
- End of Process Out of Area within 476m radius



What happened last year?

- Redland Green
- 1st Round In Area within 900m radius
- End of Process In Area with 999m radius
- There are applicants living outside the priority area with siblings who missed out
- Cotham
- 1st Round Everybody within a 2.093km radius
- End of Process In Area with 2.059km radius



What happened last year?

- Bristol Cathedral Choir School
- Received 1331 application!
- Only 17 places left for random allocation
- Colston's Girls' School
- Received 735 applications!
- Only 51 places left for random allocation
- St Mary Redcliffe & Temple
- Talk to School
