Drop off and pick up

 Please drop your children off at the classroom door between 8.45am and 8.55am, registration starts promptly at 8:55am. Please collect children at 3:25pm from our classroom door.

Class Expectations

- We are continuing to practice our Redfield Way this year, and will always aim to be kind, safe and ready.
- Show and tell will take place every Friday afternoon.

• Please **do not bring in toys** or stationery from home as we have everything the children need, and it can also be upsetting if special possessions are lost or get broken.

<u>PE</u>

- Our PE days are on a **Tuesday** and a **Thursday**. Please ensure children come to school on those days wearing suitable clothing and footwear (trainers, t-shirt, leggings, joggers or shorts).
- Please ensure your child has a water bottle and suncream when necessary.

Spelling

- We are implementing spelling practice in the afternoons sometimes linked with handwriting. We complete spelling quizzes on a Thursday afternoon. Spellings can be accessed on Class Dojo and are sent home with your child weekly.
- Each week's list of words will be linked to a particular spelling pattern, phonic sounds and statutory spellings.

Reading

- Reading at home can have a huge impact on children's progress, as well as encouraging them to read for pleasure.
- All children will bring reading books home from school, and they may have books of their own choice from home or the public library that they choose to read.
- Children should read to an adult at least 5 times a week for 10 minutes.
- If your child mainly reads on their own, it is helpful to talk to them about what they're reading and ask them to summarise what they have read so far.
- Please record in your child's reading record when they have read. This can simply be a signature.

Further home learning

- 1. Read **every day** (at least 5x per week) with your child and record the book title, page number and comment in **reading record**.
- 2. Practice partitioning numbers e.g, 60 = 6 tens and 0 ones
- 3. Read around our topic of The Great Fire of London.
- 4. Writing at home send a letter to a friend, write a recipe ...

Communication

- Class Dojo is the easiest way to contact us. We aim to reply to Class Dojo messages within 2 working days.
- Please do not use Class Dojo for emergency messages as we cannot check them while teaching or in meetings. Continue to call the office for emergency messages.
- A member of the Year 2 team will be available on the classroom door at 3.25pm every day. We are happy to catch up for an informal chat and can arrange a meeting for longer conversations we will aim to arrange meetings within a week.
- We will send out all school messages through Class Dojo, so please let us know as soon as possible if you are having trouble accessing your account. We will also update Class Dojo with news about our learning in class and photos of the children's work.
- If you haven't done so already, check that you have given consent for pictures to be uploaded to the Class Dojo platform. Images will not be shared; they are for sharing our learning experiences only.
- The school website will be updated termly to share topics maps, spelling lists and any additional resources that can support learning at home.
